FROM THE SUPERVISOR

I've always said two of our strongest assets in Berne are its rich natural resources and the residents that live here. This could not be more evident, as seen through the outpouring of support and interest in the Game Farm Road Project. The Town had a record eighteen applicants apply for our Game Farm Road Board. In addition, many residents called and asked how they might participate going forward.



The Town Board and Highway Superintendant Bashwinger, have started preliminary plans for the construction of a new salt-storage shed. As you may have noticed, clearing of the west end of the highway department has begun in preparation for the new salt shed.

Also, our highway garage is in need of upgrading and expansion so planning for that is also in the works. While the Town has made purchases of approximately \$480,000 in needed highway equipment, the Town's General and Highway Funds remain debt free - all without raising your property taxes. The Town Board will continue to find creative ways to provide services to our residents without increasing property taxes.

DJD YOU KNOW??

The Town of Berne owns the boat launch at Thompson's Lake, just down from the old Thompson's Lake Hotel. An agreement with the Town and the New York State Department of Conservation (DEC) allows use of the boat launch to the public. In return, DEC maintains the launch and has slated improvements for this year such as additional parking and black top for easier access. Also, in return for the agreement, DEC stocks the lake with fish every year. This year, 550 brown trout and 1,700 rainbows were released into the lake. So grab your fishing poles & kids, and head over to Thompson's Lake for a fun day of fishing.

NEW LOOK AT THE BERNE TOWN PARK

Summer will soon be upon us. With it comes Little League, ice cream after a dusty game, and children playing in the park. Plans are underway to make it a safer, happier place to play.

Resurfacing of the swing sets in both Town parks is scheduled to take place early this summer. A carpet of 12" deep engineered wood fiber will be installed under each swing set, with wear mats anchored firmly under each belt swing. Two full bucket seats will be added at each park so our littlest ones can enjoy swinging with older friends & family.



In the meantime, keep your eyes peeled for the NHPA regulation horseshoe courts that will soon be built. Available for anyone interested in playing a game or two, the courts will be the site of a Horseshoe Tournament at Summerfest, on August 22. The tournament will benefit LEAP.....Life Enrichment through Activities and Programs...a nonprofit organization, located in East Berne, which provides scholarships to children, young adults, and veterans with special needs. The scholarships support participation in programs such as equine assisted therapies, and recreational and educational activities. HIGHWAY HAPPENINGS

Thanks to the generous contribution by Sheriff Apple and his work force, the Highway Department has been able to save funds and spruce up the Highway Garage. This extra work force also helped with clearing brush, sweeping and filling pot holes on town roads. We hope to be able to continue these projects throughout the summer and fall. A parking lot is under construction for a baseball field located on Canady Hill. Solid trees that were removed are being transformed into side boards and deck planking for our trucks and trailers; and for wooden forms to be used for a Town Park project.



A new truck has been purchased and should arrive at the end of this month. Paving of roads will begin soon and funds from CHIPS will be used to pave extra roads as well. The Highway Department will be ditching and looking for places to dump material. LIFESAVING DEFIBRILATORS INSTALLED



Every year in the United States over 350 thousand people die from cardiac arrest outside a hospital setting. Most of these heart attacks are caused by ventricular fibrillation. In many cases, this irregular type of heart rhythm can be converted back to normal by an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED).

The Town purchased four AED's and has installed them in the Town Hall, Town Highway Garage, the Berne Senior Center and the Berne Library.

Town Highway Department and Town Hall employees received proper training in the use of the AED's. This training was provided by the Albany County Sheriff's Department and was conducted by Paramedic Supervisor Nancy Montesanto. Many thanks to Nancy and Commander Brian Wood, both from the Sheriff's Department.


